Village history restored to original splendour

A PRINTING firm has helped to restore a book about the history of a Cambridgeshire village.

A Record of Shelford Parva by Fanny Wale was written and illustrated between 1908 and 1919, but never officially published. The only copy, which was handmade, is held in the Cambridgeshire Collection archive at Cambridge Central Library.

Now, with the help of lottery funding, Victoire Press has pieced together a replica of the book, which tells the history of the village, now Little Shelford.

The firm's managing director, Tony Elliot, and local historian David Mar-

tin, a village resident, worked together on the project.

Mr Martin said: "The Heritage Lottery Funding has made it possible to reproduce this important piece of local history.

"The people at Victoire have really taken it under their wing and their attention to detail has been incredible.

"They seemed to understand straight away what I was trying to achieve and I think Fanny Wale would have been very proud of what they've achieved with her book."

The book was printed at the end of last year and sold out, but an additional print run is being arranged.
