

WIGMORE of LITTLE SHELFORD

¹³ -- **WIGMORE**, of Norfolk., M -- . In the 'Visitation of Lincoln' made by Sir Edward Bysshe in 1666 he was recorded as ō .Wigmore of í in com. Norfolkö & as the father of ōDaniel eldest sonne [sic] objit [sic] s.p.ö, ōHenry, 2nd sonneö & ōRichard Wigmore of the Isle of Ely in com. Cambridge 3rd sonneö. He had issue:

1. Daniel (Very Rev), M.A., B.D., of Ely & Little Shelford Hall, Co. Cambs., Born c. 1575. Educ. Queenø College, Cambridge University ó recorded as ōDaniel Wigmore of Cambridgeshireö he was admitted sizar, 9 May 1592 & matriculated, 1592. Graduated B.A., 1595/6. Fellow of Queenø College, 1598-c. 1610. Created M.A., 1599 & B.D., 1609. Ordained a deacon & a priest on the same day by Bishop Martin Heton at the -Bishopø Chapelø Downham, Co. Cambs., 28 Dec. 1602. Made a minor canon of Ely, 1605. Appointed Master of Ely Grammar School, 1609. Instituted Rector of Wentworth, Co. Cambs., 2 Nov. 1610. Divinity Lecturer of Ely Cathedral, 1611. Vicar of Trinity Church, Ely. Prebendary of Ely, 1614-46. Rector of Northwold, Norfolk, 3 Dec. 1616 to 1622. Appointed Archdeacon of Ely by Bishop Lancelot Andrewes, 16 March 1616/7, which office he held until 1644. Rector of Snailwell, Co. Cambs., 1622-37. He purchased the Manor of Little Shelford (a three-storey red brick mansion with gabled wings & a large piazza built by Sir Horatio Palavicini in the late 16th century in the Italianate style & surrounded by a moat) from John Gill sometime after 1634. Recorded as ōDaniell [sic] Wigmore, Archdeacon of Elyö he appears, along with the future Lord Protector Oliver Cromwell & others, in the records as a feoffee [trustee] of the Parsonø Charity, Ely, 1635 to 1641. As patron of the parish of Little Shelford he appointed his nephew Gilbert Wigmore as Rector of that parish, 5 Oct. 1641. Mentioned in the will of his brother Richard as ömy brother Daniel Wigmoreö under which he received a bequest of öa booke [sic] called Barondusö, 26 June 1643. Despite his relationship with Cromwell, or perhaps because of it, it is recorded that öthe Bishop of Ely, Fuller the Dean, and Wigmore the Archdeacon, were all severely handled during the rebellionö. In the 'Journal of the House of Commons, Volume IV 1644-6' it was recorded

öResolved that this House doth accept the sum of £1,500, for a fine, for the delinquency of Daniel Wigmore, Esquire: And that, upon payment of the said fine of £1,500, that an ordinance be brought for the discharge of his delinquency, & for the taking the sequestration off from his estateö, 12 Aug. 1645. It was recorded in the 'Calendar of the Proceedings of the Committee for Advance of Money, 1642-56' as follows ó ö29 April 1645 - Dan. Wigmore, late Archdeacon of Ely; Note that Gilbert Wigmore is to bring in Dan. Wigmoreø particulars. 21 Aug. 1646 ó Daniel assessed at £800. 2 Oct. 1646 ó His assessment respited, on his giving security to abide the order of this committee about it, when he has made his composition at Goldsmithø Hall. 2 Dec. 1646 ó Order for seizure of his rents & estate, to pay his assessment of £800. 20 Jan. 1647 ó Gilbert Wigmore to have a fortnight to bring in particulars. 29 Jan. 1647 ó Danielø assessment & the sequestration of his estate discharged, he having paid £200 in co. Norfolkö. Will dated 19 Aug. 1646 ó in which he was described as öDaniell [sic] Wigmore Archdeacon of Elyö & mentioned öthe sons of my brother Mr Richard Wigmore late of Suttonö & left the bulk of his estate to ömy well beloved kinsman Gilbert Wigmore of Little Shelford, Clerkö. Bur. 9 Nov. 1646 at Little Shelford, s.p. Will Proved at the Archdeaconry Court

3. Richard (Rev.), M.A., of Sutton, Co. Cambs., Born c. 1585. Educ. Queen's College, Cambridge University & recorded as Richard Wigmore of Cambridgeshire & he was admitted sizar, 1 June 1603. Graduated B.A., 1607 & M.A., 1611. Ordained a deacon & priest at Norwich, Norfolk, 24 Sept. 1609. Recorded as Richard Wigmore of Newton, Isle of Ely & he was licensed as curate of Newton in the Isle of Ely, 3 April 1610. M 1612 at Great Livermore, Suffolk, Bridget, sister of Rev. Stephen Newcome, M.A., Rector of Caldecote, Co. Hunts. & d. of Rev. Stephen Newcome, B.A., of Ely & his wife, a sister of Dr. John Copley, D.D., M.A., Rector of Girton & Newton, Co. Cambs. Rev. Henry Newcombe (1627-1695), in his 'Autobiography' wrote 'My grandfather died young; left two children, Stephen & Bridget. My aunt [Bridget] married Mr Richard Wigmore, vicar of Sutton, & parson of Meple [sic] in the Isle of Ely, brother of Archdeacon Wigmore, a man famous for the great estate he left to Dr. Wigmore, late fellow of Queen's College in Cambridge. He was licensed as a curate of Streatham & Thetford Chapel, 21 June 1616. Instituted Vicar of St. Andrew's Church, Sutton, Co. Cambs., 19 Dec. 1617, which office he held until his death. Rector of Mepal, Co. Cambs., 1626-39. Mentioned in the will of his brother Daniel as 'my brother Mr Richard Wigmore late of Sutton in the County aforesaid clerk', 19 Aug. 1646. Will dated 26 June 1643 & in which he was described as Richard Wigmore of Sutton within the Isle of Ely Clerk. Died 11 July 1643. Bur. Sutton. Will Proved at the Archdeaconry Court of Ely, 2 Aug. 1643. He had issue:

1a. Stephen (Rev.), M.A., of Mepal, Co. Cambs., Born c. 1617. Educ. Queen's College, Cambridge University & matriculated sizar, Easter 1634. Graduated B.A., 1636/7 & M.A., 1640. Ordained a deacon at Peterborough, 22 Dec. 1639. Appointed Rector of Mepal, 17 April 1640, which office he held until 1662. Mentioned in his father's will under as 'my sonne [sic] Steven [sic] which he was appointed executor, 26 June 1643. M -- . Died 1662. He had issue:

1b. Richard, of Stamford, Co. Lincoln, Bapt. 10 Oct. 1646 at Mepal. M 1674 at Holy Trinity Church, Ely, Sarah Some (Mentioned in her husband's will as 'my beloved [sic] wife', 5 March 1677/8. Mentioned in the will of her husband's uncle Daniel Wigmore as 'my cousin Sarah Wigmore late wife to Richard Wigmore deceased', 22 Aug. 1682). Will dated 5 March 1677/8 & in which he was described as Richard Wigmore of Stamford in the County of Lincoln [sic] Woollen Draper & mentioned 'my uncle Daniel Wigmore, whom he appointed to be supervisor of his will, & 'my kinsman Beaumont Bodenham, Esq.'. Mentioned in the will of his uncle Daniel Wigmore as 'Richard Wigmore late of Stamford Draper lately deceased', 22 Aug. 1682. Bur. 13 March 1677/8 at Stamford & recorded in the burial register as 'Mr Richard Wigmore'. Will Proved at P.C.C., 10 May 1678. He had issue:

3c. Richard, Born 15 May 1677 at Stamford. 2b. Mary, Mentioned in the will of her brother Richard as 'my sister Mary Wigmore' under which she received a bequest of £50, 5 March 1677/8. M 7 Aug. 1679 at Witham-on-the-Hill, Co. Lincoln, Rev. Robert Butcher (He & his wife were mentioned in the will of his wife's paternal uncle Daniel Wigmore of Stamford as 'Robert Butcher of Twywell in the County of Northampton, Clerk' Mary his now wife, 22 Aug. 1682). She was mentioned in the will of her paternal uncle Daniel Wigmore of Stamford as 'my cousin Mary Butcher aforesaid', 22 May 1682.

2a. Daniel, J.P., of Stamford, Co. Lincoln, Born 1621 at Sutton. Mentioned in his father's will as 'my sonne [sic] Daniel', 26 June 1643. Mentioned in the autobiography of his 1st cousin Rev. Henry Newcome (1627-1695) as 'my cousin Daniel Wigmore of Stamford', 1651. M 1st Elizabeth, d. of John Hand, Esq., of the Isle of Ely, Co. Camb. M 2nd Frances Hughes, of Hereford (Bur. 11 June 1652 at Stamford). In 1664 he took on the construction of the beleaguered Welland Navigation Canal & made it navigable from Stamford to Deeping at a cost of £5000. M Lic. issued 14 April 1665 & in which he & his 3rd wife were recorded as 'Daniel Wigmore, of Stamford, co. Lincoln, Gent., Widower, 40 & Frances Herris [sic], Spinster, daughter of Frances Priestly, of St. Botolph Aldersgate, London, Widow, who consented'. M 3rd 18 April 1665 at St. Christopher le Stocks Church, London, Frances Harris (Born 1643). Recorded as 'aged 46', 1665. Mayor of Stamford, 1667 & 1684. Mentioned in the will of his nephew Richard Wigmore as 'my uncle Daniel Wigmore' 5 March 1677/8. Lieutenant of the Lincolnshire Militia, 1680. Will dated 22 Aug. 1682 & in which he was described as 'Daniel Wigmore of Stamford in the County of Lincoln, Esquire & in which he referred to owing various properties at Stamford & the Manor of Spalding, Co. Lincoln. Bur. 12 July 1687 at Stamford & recorded in the burial register as 'Daniel Wigmore, Esq.'. Will Proved at P.C.C., 5 Aug. 1687. He had issue by his 1st wife:

- B.D., D.D., of Little Shelford, Co. Cambs. & his wife Sabina Worsley – See **BELOW**. He was mentioned in the will of Richard Wigmore, 1st cousin of his 2nd wife, as ömy kinsman Beaumont Bodenhamö, 5 March 1677/8. He was mentioned in the will of his father-in-law Daniel Wigmore as öBeaumont Bodenham, Esq., late of Ryhall lately deceasedö, 22 Aug. 1682. Died 1681. Will Proved at P.C.C., 16 Nov. 1681) (See **HARINGTON**). Mentioned in her fatherö will as ömy daughter Elizabeth Bodenhamö, 22 Aug. 1682. M 2nd Edward Browne, Esq., of Gretford. Died 3 May 1701. Bur. Gretford. She had issue:

In the ‘*Visitation of Lincoln*’ made by Sir Edward Bysshe in 1666 he was recorded as öHenry, 2nd sonne [sic]ö brother of öDaniel eldest sonne [sic] obijt [sic] s.p.ö & öRichard Wigmore of the Isle of Ely in com. Cambridge 3rd sonne [sic]ö & son of öI .Wigmore of i in com. Norfolkö. M 9 Oct. 1608 at St. Brideö Church, Fleet Street, London, Ursula Wiseman. Bur. 3 May 1619 at St. Brideö Church, Fleet Street, London. He had issue:
- 11 **REV. DR. GILBERT WIGMORE, M.A., B.D., D.D.**, of Cambridge & Little Shelford Manor, Co. Cambs., Born c. 1609. Educ. Queenö College, Cambridge University ö recorded as öGilbert Wigmore of Huntingdonshireö he matriculated as a pensioner, 1625. Graduated B.A., 1628/9 & M.A., 1632. Oates in his ‘*Cambridge University Library: A History from the beginnings to the Copyright Act of Queen Ann*’ recorded that ö[Abraham Wheelocke] had indeed canvassed for the librarianship during the last weeks of the lifetime of his predecessor Thomas Brooke, obtaining from Gilbert Wigmore of Queenö College the promise that he would recommend him for the appointment both to the President of Queenö & to his uncle Daniel Wigmore, the archdeacon of Elyö, 1629. In a letter he wrote to Abraham Wheelocke he remarked öMr Boise is fallen in love with Arabicke [sic], & that which seemed before to him very difficult, now he thinketh [sic] to be easie [sic]: he can read most wordes [sic] with recourse to the Alphabette [sic] I have shewed [sic] Mr Boise your Arabicke [sic] notes & he liketh [sic] them very well wherever he could read them: but in many places we could not read them. I have now sent them back again, because you may have use of themö, 27 Aug. 1629. Fellow of Queenö College, Cambridge University, 1632-9. Ordained a priest by Francis White, Bishop of Ely, 20 Sept. 1635. Licensed as a priest by Cambridge University, 4 Nov. 1637. Rector of Snailwell, Co. Cambs., 1637-41. Created B.D., 1639 & D.D., 1661. M c. 1640 Sabina (Born c. 1620). She was mentioned in her fatherö will as öSabina my daughterö under which she received a bequest to be paid to her at her öage of one and twenty yearsö, 25 Oct. 1625. She was mentioned in the will of her stepfather Sir John Poley as ömy daughter-in-law Sabina Worsleyö under which she received a legacy of £1300 öto be paid her at her date of marriageö, 1 Sept. 1638. She was mentioned in her motherö will as ömy daughter Sabina Wigmore wife of Gilbert Wigmore of Shelford in the County of Cambridge Clerkö, 5 Sept. 1652. In legal proceedings brought against her, her husband & sons William & Gilbert by Gregory Gawsell in the Court of Chancery concerning certain lands & houses in Wormegay & Tottenhill, Norfolk previously

owned by her mother & stepfather she was described as the daughter of ðDame Abigail Pooleyð widow of ðSir John Pooleyð, & as wife of ðGilbert Wigmoreð, 28 Feb. 1655/6. Her husband wrote a letter to her 1st cousin Elizabeth Staynes & her aunt Susan Worsley thanking them for inviting her daughter Ursula to stay with them to avoid the ðsicknessð to which she presumably succumbed shortly thereafter, 29 Aug. 1659. Bur. 7 Sept. 1659 at Little Shelford ð recorded in the burial register as ðWigmore Sabina wife of Gilbert parsonð, d. of John Worsley, Esq., M.A., of Deeping Gate, in the Parish of Maxey, Co. Northants. & Boxted, Suffolk & his wife Abigail (M 2nd Sir John Poley, Kt., of Wormegay, Norfolk who died 3 Dec. 1638), d. of William Wickes, Esq., of Clare, Suffolk (See **WORSLEY**). He was appointed

Rector of All Saintø Church, Little Shelford by his uncle Rev. Daniel Wigmore, Archdeacon of Ely & Lord of the Manor of Little Shelford, 5 Oct. 1641, which living he held until 1668. He corresponded with Abraham Wheelocke, the Arabic scholar, & it appears that Wheelocke made several visits to Little Shelford in 1643 & 1644. According to Hessayon in his 'Gold tried in the fire: the prophet Theauau John Tany & the English Revolution' ð ðWigmore was also the incumbent when William Dowsing former provost-marshal of the Easter Association Army arrived in the parish on 12 March 1644. Dowsing had been commissioned by the Earl of Manchester, commander of the Eastern Association to implement the

Parliamentary ordinance of Aug. 1643 requiring the removal & destruction of all ðMonuments of Superstition or Idolatryð As in his visits to other Cambridgeshire churches, Dowsing obeyed his instructions without hesitation & to the letter. Perhaps accompanied by a deputy & an escort of soldiers he ordered the destruction of three ðsuperstitious inscriptions, two ðcrosses, one on the Steple [sic]ð a ðCrucifixð & thirty ðPicturesð In addition he demanded that the minister have the chancel steps leveledf ð Mentioned in the will of his uncle Rev. Daniel Wigmore, Archdeacon of Ely, as ðmy well beloved kinsman Gilbert Wigmore of Little Shelford in the County of Cambridge Clerkð under which he inherited a lease of the Rectory of Ely and the Chapel of Shotesham & other lands in Little Shelford ðver & beyond the manor lands & hereditaments I gave & settled upon him at his marriageð, 19 Aug. 1646. He & his wife made settlements concerning the Manor of Grendon, Co. Northants., 1648, 1653 & 1655. He was mentioned in the will of his mother-in-law Dame Abigail Poley as ðmy son-in-law Gilbert Wigmore of Shelford in the County of Cambridge Clerkð under which he was appointed an executor with his wifeø brother-in-law Henry Clifton, 5 Sept. 1652. He, his wife & sons William & Gilbert were

defendants in legal proceedings brought by Gregory Gawsell in the Court of Chancery concerning certain lands & houses in Wormegay & Tottenhill, Norfolk previously owned by his mother-in-law & her 2nd husband Sir John Poley, 28 Feb. 1655/6. He & his wifeø brother-in-law Henry Clifton, as executors of his mother-in-lawø will, sued his wifeø paternal aunt Susan Worsley for losses sustained as the result of her alleged breach of trust concerning a bond for £100 owed to his father-in-law John Worsley by Richard Bullingham, 28 May 1657. He wrote a letter to his wifeø 1st cousin Elizabeth Staynes & her aunt Susan Worsley thanking them for inviting his daughter Ursula to stay with them to avoid the ðsicknessð to which his wife presumably succumbed shortly thereafter, 29 Aug. 1659.

At the admission of his son Daniel to Grayø Inn he was recorded as ðGilbert Wigmore of Shelford, co. Cambridge, S.T.P [Sacrae Theologiae Professor]ð, 4 May 1661. Recorded as ðGilbert Wigmore of Little Shelford, Doctor of Divinityð he was mentioned in the will of his wifeø brother-in-law Henry Clifton of Toftrees, Norfolk, 1668. At the admission of his son Gilbert to the Middle Temple he was recorded as ðGilbert Wigmore of Cambridge University Doctor of Theologyð, 25 Oct. 1669. In the 'Proceedings of the Cambridge Antiquarian Society' it was recorded ðRev. Dr Gilbert Wigmore, of Queensø lived in 1674 in a large house with 18 chimneys: this may have been the old Augustinian Friarsøbuilding, where in the former roll (1664) we find Mr Thomas Buck, the

well-known Esquire Bedell & University Printer, residing. Will dated 6 June 1682 in which he was described as Gilbert Wigmore of Cambridge, Doctor of Divinity & mentioned owing freehold & copyhold lands & tenements with their appurtenances in the town & parish of Sutton, in the Isle of Ely in the County of Cambridge & copyhold lands & tenements in the town of Whittlesford in the County of Cambridge. Died 16 Aug. 1682 as recorded on his gravestone. 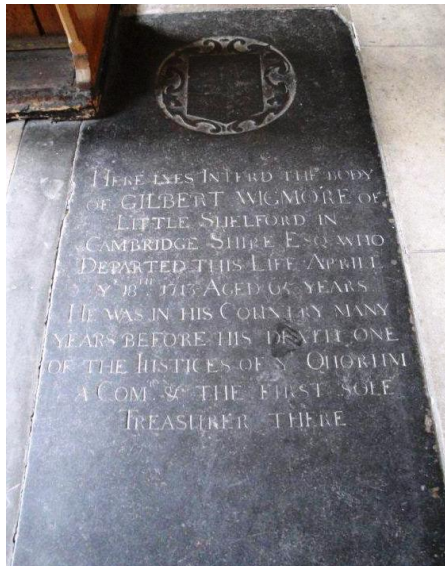
