Made a minor canon of Ely, 1605. Appointed Master of Ely Grammar School, 1609. Instituted Rector of Wentworth, Co. Cambs., 2 Nov. 1610. Divinity Lecturer of Ely Cathedral, 1611. Vicar of Trinity Church, Ely. Prebendary of Ely, 1614-46. Rector of Northwold, Norfolk, 3 Dec. 1616 to 1622. Appointed Archdeacon of Ely by Bishop Lancelot Andrewes, 16 March 1616/7, which office he held until 1644. Rector of Snailwell, Co. Cambs., 1622-37. He purchased the Manor of Little Shelford (a three-storey red brick mansion with gabled wings & a large piazza built by Sir Horatio Palavicini in the late 16th century in the Italianate style & surrounded by a moat) from John Gill sometime after 1634. Recorded as õDaniell [sic] Wigmore, Archdeacon of Ely® he appears, along with the future Lord Protector Oliver Cromwell & others, in the records as a feofee [trustee] of the Parson® Charity, Ely, 1635 to 1641. As patron of the parish of Little Shelford he appointed his

nephew Gilbert Wigmore as Rector of that parish, 5 Oct. 1641. Mentioned in the will of his brother Richard as omy brother Daniel Wigmoreö under which he received a bequest of oa booke [sic] called Barondusö, 26 1643. June Despite his relationship with Cromwell, or perhaps because of it, it is recorded that othe Bishop of Ely, Fuller the Dean, and Wigmore the Archdeacon, were severely handled during the rebellionö. In the 'Journal of the House of Commons, Volume IV 1644-6 it was recorded

Will dated 19 Aug. 1646 ó in which he was described as ŏDaniell [sic] Wigmore Archdeacon of Elyö & mentioned ŏthe four sons of my brother Mr Richard Wigmore late of Suttonö & left the bulk of his estate to ŏmy well beloved kinsman Gilbert Wigmore of Little Shelford, Clerkö. Bur. 9 Nov. 1646 at Little Shelford, s.p. Will Proved at the Archdeaconry Court

Will dated 22 Aug. 1682 ó in which he was described as oDniel Wigmore of Stamford in the County of Lincoln, Esquire & in which he referred to owing various properties at Stamford & the Manor of Spalding, Co. REV. DR. GILBERT WIGMORE, M.A., B.D., D.D., of Cambridge & Little Shelford Manor, Co. Cambs., Born c. 1609. Educ. Queenøs College, Cambridge University ó recorded as õGilbert Wigmore of Huntingdonshireö he matriculated as a pensioner, 1625. Graduated B.A., 1628/9 & M.A., 1632. Oates in his 'Cambridge University Library: A History from the beginnings to the Copyright Act of Queen Ann' recorded that õ[Abraham Wheelocke] had indeed canvassed for the librarianship during the last weeks of the lifetime of his predecessor Thomas Brooke, obtaining from Gilbert Wigmore of Queensø College the promise that he would recommend him for the appointment both to the President of

Oueensø & to his uncle Daniel Wigmore, the archdeacon of Elyö, 1629. In a letter he wrote to Abraham Wheelocke he remarked õMr Boise is fallen in love with Arabicke [sic], & that which seemed before to him very difficult, now he thinketh [sic] to be easie [sic]: he can read most wordes [sic] with recourse to the Alphabethe [sic]í I have shewed [sic] Mr Boise your Arabicke [sic] notes & he liketh [sic] them very well wherever he could read them: but in many places we could not read them. I have now sent them back again, because you may have use of themö, 27 Aug. 1629. Fellow of Queenøs College, Cambridge University, 1632-9. Ordained a priest by Francis White, Bishop of Ely, 20 Sept. 1635.

She was mentioned in her fatherøs will as õSabina my daughterö under which she received a bequest to be paid to her at her õage of one and twenty yearsö, 25 Oct. 1625. She was mentioned in the will of her stepfather Sir John Poley as õmy daughter-in-law Sabina Worsleyö under which she received a legacy of £1300 õto be paid her at her date of marriageö, 1 Sept. 1638. She was mentioned in her motherøs will as õmy daughter Sabina Wigmore wife of Gilbert Wigmore of Shelford in the County of Cambridge Clerkö, 5 Sept. 1652. In legal proceedings brought against her, her husband & sons William & Gilbert by Gregory Gawsell in the

Court of Chancery concerning certain lands & houses in Wormegay & Tottenhill, Norfolk previously owned by her mother & stepfather she was described as the daughter of õDame Abigail Pooleyö widow of õSir John Pooleyö, & as wife of õGilbert Wigmoreö, 28 Feb. 1655/6. Her husband wrote a letter to her 1st cousin Elizabeth Staynes & her aunt Susan Worsley thanking them for inviting her daughter Ursula to stay with them to avoid the osicknesso to which she presumably succumbed shortly thereafter, 29 Aug. 1659. Bur. 7 Sept. 1659 at Little Shelford ó recorded in the burial register as õWigmore Sabina wife of Gilbert parsonö), d. of John Worsley, Esq., M.A., of Deeping Gate, in the Parish of Maxey, Co. Northants. & Boxted,

Suffolk & his wife Abigail (M 2<sup>nd</sup> Sir John Poley, Kt., of Wormegay, Norfolk who died 3 Dec. 1638), d. of William Wickes, Esq., of Clare, Suffolk (See WORSLEY). He was appointed Rector of All Saintøs Church, Little Shelford by his uncle Rev. Daniel Wigmore, Archdeacon of Ely & Lord of the Manor of Little Shelford, 5 Oct. 1641, which living he held until 1668. He corresponded with Abraham Wheelocke, the Arabic scholar, & it appears that Wheelocke made several visits to Little Shelford in 1643 & 1644. According to Hessayon in his 'Gold tried in the fire: the prophet Theauau John Tany & the English Revolution' 6 õWigmore was also the incumbent when William Dowsing former provost-marshall of the Easter Association Army arrived in the parish on 12 March 1644. Dowsing had been commissioned by the Earl of Manchester, commander of the Eastern Association to implement the Parliamentary ordinance of Aug. 1643 requiring the removal & destruction of all :Monuments of Superstition or Idolatryø. As in his visits to other Cambridgeshire churches, Dowsing obeyed his instructions without hesitation & to the letter. Perhaps accompanied by a deputy & an escort of soldiers he ordered the destruction of three -superstitious inscriptions, two -crosses, one on the Steple [sic]ø a

:Crucifixø & thirty :Picturesø In addition he demanded that the minister have the chancel steps leveledí ö Mentioned in the will of his uncle Rev. Daniel Wigmore, Archdeacon of Ely, as omy well beloved kinsman Gilbert Wigmore of Little Shelford in the County of Cambridge Clerkö under which he inherited a lease of the Rectory of Ely and the Chapel of Shotesham & other lands in Little Shelford õover & beyond the manor lands & hereditaments I gave & settled upon him at his marriageö, 19 Aug. 1646. He & his wife made settlements concerning the Manor of Grendon, Co. Northants., 1648, 1653 & 1655. He was mentioned in the will of his mother-in-law Dame Abigail Poley as õmy son-in-law Gilbert Wigmore of Shelford in the County of



Queen's College, Cambridge University

Cambridge Clerkö under which he was appointed an executor with his wife@s brother-in-law Henry Clifton, 5 Sept. 1652. He, his wife & sons William & Gilbert were defendants in legal proceedings brought by Gregory Gawsell in the Court of Chancery concerning certain lands & houses in Wormegay & Tottenhill, Norfolk previously owned by his mother-in-law & her 2<sup>nd</sup> husband Sir John Poley, 28 Feb. 1655/6. He & his wife@s brother-in-law Henry Clifton, as executors of his mother-in-law@s will, sued his wife@s paternal aunt Susan Worsley for losses sustained as the result of her alleged breach of trust concerning a bond for £100 owed to his father-in-law John Worsley by Richard Bullingham, 28 May 1657. He wrote a letter to his wife@s 1<sup>st</sup> cousin Elizabeth Staines & her aunt Susan Worsley thanking

them for inviting his daughter Ursula to stay with them to avoid the õsicknessö to which his wife presumably succumbed shortly thereafter, 29 Aug. 1659. At the admission of his son Daniel to Grayes Inn he was recorded as õGilbert Wigmore of Shelford, co. Cambridge, S.T.P [Sacrae Theologiae Professor]ö, 4 May 1661. Recorded as õGilbert Wigmore of Little Shelford, Doctor of Divinityö he was mentioned in the will of his wife brother-in-law Henry Clifton of Toftrees, Norfolk, 1668. At the admission of his son Gilbert to the Middle Temple he was recorded as õGilbert Wigmore of Cambridge University Doctor of Theologyö, 25 Oct. 1669. In the 'Proceedings of the Cambridge Antiquarian Society' it was recorded of Rev. Dr Gilbert Wigmore, of Oueenson lived in 1674 in a large house with 18 chimneys: this may have been the old Augustinian Friarsø building, where in the former roll (1664) we find Mr Thomas Buck, the well-known Esquire Bedell & University Printer, residingö. 
